# 6.S196: Principles and Practice of Assistive Technology Human Subjects Training, 3PM, Monday, September 17, 2012

## **Objectives:**

• Understand the ethical obligations of research with human subjects

### Activities

• Take an online human subjects training course

#### Deliverables

Gradebook or certificate of completion, due before lab on Wednesday, September 19 (3pm)

In this lab activity, you will take MIT's online human subjects training course, in order to prepare you to interact with human subjects.

If you have already taken the online training course for a UROP or some other MIT class, then you don't need to take it again. Just hand in your certificate of completion or some other evidence that you passed. The training site includes a list of all people who have passed the course, so if you're not sure whether you've done it, you can scan that list for your name and date of completion.

### **Instructions for Monday, September 17:**

1. Go to http://web.mit.edu/committees/couhes/humansubjects.shtml and follow one of the links to the CITI site, depending on your status:

**For MIT Faculty, staff, or students:** Please log into the CITI site via the MIT portal. You will need an MIT personal certificate for authentication. If you do not have a valid MIT certificate, you can get one here.

**For non MIT personnel:** Please log into the <u>University of Miami CITI site</u>. When registering for the course, select 'Massachusetts Institute of Technology - Affiliates' as your institution.

2. After logging into the site, choose the Human Subjects training for Social & Behavioral Research Investigators (see image on following page). **Do not select the Responsible Conduct of Research course.** You aren't being asked to do the RCR course as part of this lab.



3. After choosing the Human Subjects course, you should see the list of course modules below:



You're expected to complete the first seven modules, as shown in the image below (from Introduction up to and including Privacy & Confidentiality). You should get at least a 90% overall. You can repeat a quiz as many times as you want, however, so there's really no reason why you shouldn't get 100. When you're done, your gradebook should look something like this:
